

Hello again,

Another week, another Monday morning with fresh subjects, assignments and challenges ahead.

It was a challenging week that has just past – two practical tasks for teacher training – one a 20mins class that we had to teach our fellow students and then a 25mins lesson on Friday to teach. We both passed and are glad that they are completed. We also were studying the book of Ephesians – in particular looking at the great truths of the Trinity, of what Christ has done for us and how rich we are in Christ – if we have trusted Him as our Saviour and are making Him Lord of our lives – it was very encouraging to be reminded of that.



The biggest challenge has been leaving the girls on Sunday morning to come back here to finish our studies for these last weeks. We flew home with them on Friday afternoon, spent Saturday doing washing, weeding, seeing family, doing some shopping (the other students enjoyed eating potato bread, soda bread and veda that we brought back). We also found that we had two additions to our family – one of the hens had hatched out two chicks!! We then flew back Sunday morning leaving the girls with Jill's Mum and Dad – there were a few tears. It is so quiet here in Kilchzimmer without them but the time will pass quickly.

Our studies this week include the subjects of 'Living a victorious life', looking at the Literature CEF has on offer and building a ministry in a local area – two of these topics are taught by Kenny Martin (from N.Ireland).

As we near the end of our training we are looking forward to getting back home – especially to our own fellowship in Lisnagleer and especially our midweek times of prayer. We will be home early in the morning on Sunday 19th September. We will most likely take a few weeks off at the end of September before we start our year of practical training alongside other local workers.

We would like to thank you all for your interest and prayers over the past months, please continue to pray for us as we start practical training when we go home.
